What are SATS?

- The end of key stage assessments are intended to show if your child is working at, above or below the target level for their age. In English, maths and science.
- They enable schools and parents to see whether the school is teaching effectively by comparing their pupils' performance to national results.

What are the target levels?



How are the assessments carried out?

All children take the level 3 - 5 assessments in:

- English reading comprehension (1 hour), a Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar test (1 hour) and teacher assessment of writing
- Maths two test papers (45 minutes each) and a mental maths test with 20 questions
- Science based on teacher assessments -no formal test.

Level 6

- There are additional, level 6 assessments, for children who have been assessed as working significantly above the level for their age in maths or reading.
- These tests assess whether or not working at level 6.
- In order for their test result to be counted, students must achieve level 5 in the main test.
