Our team of specialist mental health professionals are facilitating FREE coffee and information sessions at the new Rise Community Hubs.

Rise Community Hubs have been created for Children, Young People, Families and our wider communities to offer support, information and guidance on mental health.

The first two Rise Community Hubs have now launched in the The Ratcliffe Centre (Ratcliffe Road, Atherstone, CV9 1LF), and Escape Arts (The Old Slaughterhouse Heritage & Arts Centre, The Yard, Sheep Street, Stratford-upon-Avon, CV37 6EE).

Information sessions at the Community Hubs will include a presentation of a topic, with refreshments available before and after, with a chance to meet other parents. If after the presentation, you would like to discuss your child with one of our professionals, you will be able to book into a drop-in consultation slot later in the morning or another week depending on availability.
