As part of this activity, Peopletoo, who are leading the review on behalf of Warwickshire County Council with support from Warwickshire Parent Carer Voice, would like to hear the experiences of parent carers, including what works well and where things could be improved. This will really help to gain a picture of what social care support is like for children with SEND in Warwickshire.

There are several ways you can share your views:

Online survey

You can share feedback via an anonymous online survey that should take no longer than 10 minutes to complete. Respond to the <u>'Access to Social Care Support' survey</u> here. The survey closes on **Friday 26 April 2024**.

Online focus groups

If you are unable to complete the survey, or would like the opportunity to share your views in a different way, there are several focus groups you can attend:
