### **Forest Schools**



As the weather is getting colder, it is really important that children are dressed appropriately for their Forest School sessions. Hats and gloves are essentials as are several warm layers of clothing, extra socks and warm foot wear. Oversized wellies with thermal socks work well but if your child already has snow boots or walking boots they are ideal. Being warm can make all the difference to the children's enjoyment of the outdoor sessions

### **Emergency Closure**

As winter finally arrives we just want to remind you of our arrangements in the case of adverse weather conditions. Wherever possible, we would aim to keep the school open. However there may be occasions when we have to make the decision to close. If this is the case, we will notify families using our text messaging service and a notice will be placed on the homepage of our school website. In addition Warwickshire County Council has a page on its website where it lists any school closures. Please make sure that you keep us updated of any changes to your mobile numbers.

We would recommend that all parents sign up to the Warwickshire County Council school closures notification system for parents. The system only takes 30 seconds to sign up to via text and will then automatically send you a closure alert text once the school has notified them about an emergency closure. The system allows you to subscribe to more than one school so will now be of benefit to those of you with older children at secondary school.
