How do we spend our 'Catch Up' premium funding?

The Catch-Up premium funding has been designed to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by coronavirus (COVID-19), the grant will only be available for the 2020 to 2021 academic year. We will use this funding for specific activities to support our pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months. Our barriers to future attainment are based on the 3-tiered approach which we will focus on:

- Teaching and whole-school strategies
 - High quality teaching for all
 - Effective diagnostic assessment
 - Supporting for remote learning
 - Focussing on professional development
- Targeted support
 - High quality 1:1 or small group tuition
 - Teaching assistants and targeted support
 - Academic tutoring
 - Planning for children with SEND
- Wider strategies
 - Supporting pupils social, emotional and behavioural needs
 - Planning carefully and adapting the social and emotional learning curriculum
 - Improving the accessibility of technology to support with online intervention
 - Communicating and supporting parents
