Model writing for fact sheets, diaries, instructions, recipes, posters, leaflets and lists.

Familiarise pupils with exciting and challenging words to describe weather, events and characters.

Continued number recognition, counting and one to one correspondence.

Recognising multiples of 10.

Making links between number bonds (2 numbers added together) to 10 and corresponding bonds to 20 and 100. Recognising halves and guarters.

Indoor and outdoor activities

Planning in Reception alters with the children's ideas and interests - here are some examples of what we hope to cover. If you have any information or resources that you feel would help us at any time, please let us know.

Physical Development

<u>Outdoor games & play:</u> Developing gross motor skills through designing and constructing using large apparatus. Mixing, sorting and planting whilst controlling tools safely. Using equipment, objects and malleable materials safely and with good control.

<u>Indoor games</u> Developing skills using and controlling balls. Develop competency throwing, catching and dribbling a ball and manoeuvring through obstacles, climbing and traversing across equipment.

<u>Fine motor skills:</u> Using small tools and equipment proficiently including scissors, writing implements and tools for malleable materials. Developing a comfortable, correct pencil grip.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

Learning about the seasons, how weather changes throughout the year.

The changes in nature and the effect on animals and plant life such as hibernation and the Autumn leaf fall.


Finding out about wildlife in the countryside and the differences between nocturnal and daytime creatures and prey

and predators.

Growing seeds and plants and learning about how to care for them.
